
## **Reading Practice: Answers**

# How to Write a News Report

#### • Style:

- Write in full sentences, using correct spelling, grammar, and punctuation
- $\,\circ\,$  Write in a formal style. Avoid slang.
- $\,\circ\,$  Your audience is an adult.
- Avoid stating your opinion. You are reporting facts only.



#### How to Write a News Report

- First Paragraph:
- THE WHO (use real names)
- THE WHAT (tell what happened)
- **THE WHEN** (be specific with date and time of day, if applicable)
- THE WHERE (be as specific as possible name the building, city, even the address!)

# How to Write a News Report

- Second Paragraph:
- **THE WHY** (explain the reasons for and behind the newsworthy event)
- **THE HOW** (describe how the event happened, in chronological order)

### How to Write a News Report

#### • Third Paragraph:

- Include one or two quotation(s) from someone concerned with the event (e.g. an outlooker, a participant, a concerned citizen, etc,)
- $\circ~$  Use correct dialogue format, with correct punctuation
- Explain who the person is and who is being quoted


# How to Write a News Report

#### • Fourth Paragraph:


- End by answering the question (what is going to happen next...?)
- $\circ\,$  This gives background information
- o Avoid using a quotation to end the article




Have the students look at the news article booklet 1 page 2 and use it a template while they write their own news report






Code	Descriptor
Blank	The page is blank with nothing written or drawn in the space provided.
Illegible	The response is illegible or irrelevant to the prompt.
Off topic	The response is off topic.
Code 10	The response is related to headline and/or photo but is not a news report. OR The response is a news report related to the headline and/or photo. It identifies an ever but provides no supporting details, or provides details that are unrelated to the event. T is no evidence of organization.
Code 20	The response is related to headline and/or photo but only partly in the form of a news report. OR The response is a news report related to the headline and/or photo, but the focus on an event is unclear or inconsistent. There are insufficient supporting details: too few or reportions. There is limited evidence of organization.

















# Writing Practice: Code 60 cont'd
